

Senior Championship Kicks Off 2008 Schedule


The FSGA will open the 2008 Championship Season with the **47th Senior Amateur Championship** at **Old Corkscrew Golf Club** in Estero on April 15-17. There are six qualifiers scheduled so get your entry in by February 27.

There are two age divisions for the Senior Championship, 55-64 and 65 & over. Competitors will attempt to qualify in 18 holes of stroke play in hopes of advancing to the 54 hole stroke play Championship. New this year, a cut will be instituted after 36 holes.

This year includes 25 State Championships for golfers of all ages. Jupiter Hills Club in Tequesta will host the 91st Amateur Championship. The Four-Ball Championship will be played at TPC Sawgrass in Ponte Vedra Beach, also host site to next year's Amateur Championship. The Amateur Match Play Championship has six qualifying sites to round out the Championship field at Quail Valley Golf Club in Vero Beach as Coral Creek Club in Placida will host the 2008 Mid-Amateur Championship.

"Quick, Move that Flagstick"

Have you ever had the embarrassing experience of putting the ball too firmly and having it roll right towards the removed flagstick lying beyond

the hole?

It has happened many times before and has resulted in penalties. If I had yelled to you to "pick it up" and you did, you would have gotten the penalty and not me if you were my opponent or fellow competitor. That just didn't seem right!

Well, thankfully the Rules makers have changed that Rule and it's about time. New for 2008, here's the change.

In Rule 24-1 – Movable Obstructions, you will find the following language:

"When a ball is in motion, an obstruction that might influence the movement of the ball, other than an equipment of any player or the flagstick when attended, removed or held up, must not be moved."

In layman's terms, that means that after a player hits a ball, no player can move any man made object such as a rake or soda can, if it might alter the path of the moving ball. However, there are a couple of exceptions: equipment of any player or the flagstick when attended, removed or help up.

So if I hit my ball and it is heading right for your bag, it is OK for you to move your bag or any player's bag for that sake. The same thing now goes for a flagstick when it is lying on the ground; go ahead and move it and there will be no penalty to anyone. Let me also clarify that if the flagstick is in the hole when you hit the ball, it needs to be left there. If you or anyone pulls the flagstick out in this case, you or your opponent or fellow competitor will incur the penalty; loss of hole in match play or two strokes in stroke play. If it is your partner or caddie, you will get the penalty.

Too many people have suffered the unfortunate consequences of this Rule in its former life. I am glad to see the person trying to be the "good guy" is no longer penalized. Now as far as the player putting it too firmly getting off the hook, that's a topic for another article!

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

Course Rating Team Takes 2nd at National Calibration

The FSGA Course Rating team placed second at the USGA Eastern National Calibration at PGA Golf Club in Port St. Lucie on January 13-14. The FSGA team of **Bob Powers**, **Charlie Caravati**, **Ron Audi** and **Brian Robideau** scored an overall grade of 98.5 to take second place out of 17 teams.

The Calibration consists of an on-course section as well as a written test. The FSGA team received full credit for 38 out of the 40 obstacles rated and scored 100% on the written test.

Last year, Brian Robideau and Ron Audi were members of the FSGA winning team who placed first at the National Calibration. Ron was also awarded this year's Course Rating Volunteer-of-the-Year.

Men's Interclub Off to Great Start



FSGA Introduces "The Game" in Tampa Bay & Central Florida

Last fall, the FSGA instituted "The Game," a traveling men's game in the Tampa Bay area. After six successful events in 2007, eight more events have been added to the schedule for 2008 to include Central Florida. "The Game" is an almost-weekly golf competition held mostly on Fridays and Mondays at courses in the region.

The Game is intended to stimulate more golf rounds in the area. "If you love golf and enjoy teeing it up on Friday afternoon this game will be perfect for you," said Jim Demick, FSGA Executive Director. "We are getting great courses to participate and everyone should play more golf anyway – life is too short not to spend more time on the golf course with friends."

The Game uses stableford points for scoring. In stableford scoring, players don't get hurt by one or two bad holes and point quotas will be adjusted each week to keep everyone competitive.


