Calling all golfers and volunteers!

The 2009 Florida State Golf Association season is here and it is time to sign up!

The state's top Seniors will head to **Black Diamond Ranch** in Lecanto for the **48th Senior Amateur Championship**, April 14-16. Eight qualifying sites are available so get your entry in by March 4. The **92nd Amateur Championship** will be played at **TPC Sawgrass** and **Sawgrass Country Club** in Ponte Vedra Beach June 25-28. Entries are due by May 13 and we have sixteen locations available for qualifying. The **Four-Ball Championship** will be played at the **Ritz-Carlton Members Club** in Bradenton July 11-12. **Old Corkscrew Golf Club** in Estero will be the host to the **Amateur Match Play Championship** August 6-9.

Two tournaments are new to our schedule this year, the **Mid -Am Stroke Play** and the **Florida Open**. **Sara Bay Country Club** in Sarasota will host the Mid-Am Stroke Play April 24-26. The Florida Open will be hosted by **Quail Valley Country Club** and **John's Island West** on July 17-19 in Vero Beach.

## Wegman Wins First Winter Series Individual Event

**John Wegmann**, of Southwest Ranches, captured the first Winter Series event run by the Florida State Golf Association at **Sugarloaf Mountain Golf & Town Club** in Clermont, December 1-2.

Fighting cold temperatures and blustery conditions, Wegmann recorded a three-over par 75 in his first round and followed with a 74 in his final round, good enough for a five-stroke victory. **KC Fox**, of Sarasota, finished second with rounds of 77-74, for a 151 total.

In the Senior Division, **Brian Hawke**, of Temple Terrace, came from three strokes behind to capture the title. Hawke shot a 74 in the first round and trailed first round leader **John Hart**, of Windermere.

In the final round Hawke recorded a 75 for a 149 total and a two-stroke victory. **Keith Keister**, of Orlando, placed second with rounds of 75-76--151.

The Super Senior Division saw **Edward Craig**, of Orlando, turning in rounds of 71-75 for a 146 total and a 9-stroke victory. Craig is the 2005 Senior Amateur Champion and has 6 Winter Series titles to his name. Coming in second in the Super Senior Division was **Perry Noun**, of Daytona Beach, 74-80--154.

## Pete Williams and Thomas Midtgaard win at PGA Golf Club

The duo of **Pete Williams** and **Thomas Midtgaard** captured the Port St. Lucie Four-Ball Winter Series event at **PGA Golf Club** in Port St. Lucie, December 15-16.

Williams, of Juno Beach, and Midtgaard, of Fort Myers, were tied after shooting a six-under par 66 in the first round with the team of **Samuel Martinez**, of Miami, and **Bruce Fitzpatrick**, of Homestead. Williams and Midtgaard battled it out with Martinez and Fitzpatrick during the final round. Each team matched the other shot for shot, coming to their last hole, the ninth, still tied.

Martinez and Fitzpatrick parred the 438 yard par-4, while Williams and Midtgaard found the hole with their birdie putt. Williams and Midtgaard recorded another six-under par round of 66 for a 132 total, while Martinez and Fitzpatrick closed with a 67 for a 133 total, coming in second.

In the Senior Division, the team of **Denis Johnson**, of Palm Beach Gardens, and **Hank Schinman**, of Jupiter, held onto their one-stroke lead after shooting a first round seven-under par 65. They closed with a three-under par 69 for a 134 total, giving them a one-stroke victory over **Steve Sponder**, of Cooper City, and **Marc Rosenbaum**, of Hollywood 66-69—135.

The Super-Senior Division saw the pair of **Mark Blair** and **Bill Gromer**, both of Vero Beach, come from one-stroke behind to capture the title. After shooting a first round of three-under par 69, Blair and Gromer sat one stroke out of first place. **John Robinson** took home the title of the first Florida State Golf Association event of 2009. The Daytona Beach Winter Series event was held on the **Legends Course at LPGA International Golf Course** January 5-6.

Robinson, of Orlando, went wire-to-wire after shooting a 3-under par 69 in round one. He followed his first round with a 74 for a 1-under par 143 total, winning by four strokes. Tying for second place were **Samuel Martinez**, of Miami with rounds of 73-74 and **Scott Jones**, of Orange Park, with rounds of 72-75.

**Bob Coleman**, of The Villages, overcame a two-stroke deficit to secure the top spot in the Senior Division. ### “Is it In or Out?”

Have you ever had the discussion on the course with your opponent about what’s in bounds and what’s out of bounds? It frequently comes and up and you would be surprised to hear some of the answers.

As usual, let’s first take a look at the definition. The Rules of Golf say that “Out of Bounds is beyond the boundaries of the course or any part of the course so marked by the Committee. When out of bounds is defined by reference to stakes or a fence or as being beyond stakes or a fence, the out of bounds line is determined by the nearest inside points at ground level of the stakes or fence posts (excluding angled supports).” The part that trips up most people is which side of the stake or line is the “nearest inside point” of the stake. The answer is that the nearest inside point is the golf course side; that side nearest the fairway or green.

In the picture, you’ll notice a string that has been stretched along the nearest inside points of a couple of out of bounds stakes to check to see if this ball is in or out. (It’s a good idea to toss a hundred yards of dental floss in your bag in case you’ve got more than two bucks riding on this bet! It may be a wise investment.)

The definition goes on to tell us that “When out of bounds is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is out of bounds.” In that case, the nearest inside edge (golf course side) of the line would be the boundary line.

Also, the definition tells us that “A ball is out of bounds when all of it is out of bounds.” In the picture above, the ball is clearly out of bounds. But if it were half in and half out, it would still be in bounds. It has to be all the way out to be out of bounds.

Lastly, the definition tells us that “The out of bounds line extends vertically upwards and downwards.” So if your ball is in a bush or tree overhanging the boundary, you may have to use a plumb bob to see if it’s in or out!

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

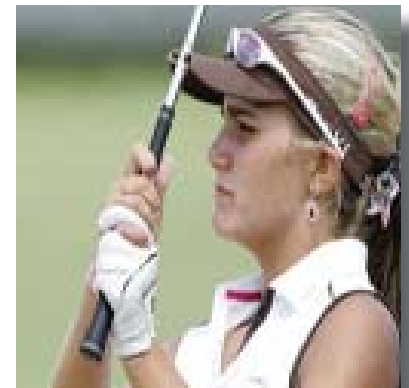
