

Galloway Captures 90th Amateur Championship

Matthew Galloway won the 90th Florida State Amateur Championship shooting a tournament total of 4-under par 280 at the Innisbrook Resort and Golf Club in Palm Harbor on June 21-24.

University of West Florida golfer, Matthew Galloway, of Valrico, had a two-stroke lead heading into the final round of play with scores of 69-70-70. Playing the Copperhead Course in the final round, Galloway, 21, posted a 35-36 to finish the day at even par and secure the Championship by two strokes. "I didn't hit the ball into trouble," said Galloway. "I hit my irons well and didn't three putt all week." On the front nine, Galloway was 2-under through four holes making birdie on holes three and four. Making the turn at 5-under for the tournament, Galloway maintained a four-stroke advantage over the field. On the back nine, Galloway was steady making pars and one bogey on the 11th hole.

After checking his two stroke lead with an official on the 16th hole, Galloway said, "I knew I just needed to finish with pars and I would be ok." Galloway did just that on 17 and saved par on 18 after driving the ball into the trees. "This wins means a lot," said Galloway. "There are a lot of good names on that trophy and it's awesome to see mine added to it." Galloway credits his coach for giving him the confidence needed to win the Championship. "After the first round, I was surprised to break par," said Galloway. "I spoke with my coach who gave me some good advice and the confidence I needed."



Isleworth Defends Club Team

Isleworth Country Club defended their title winning the 64th Club Team Championship at Stonegate Golf Club in Poinciana on May 5-6.

Isleworth Country Club, in Windermere, posted 127 stableford points in the first round to take a four point advantage heading into the final round of play. In the final round, Isleworth secured 117 points for a 244 total and capture their second consecutive Club Team Championship. **Douglas Dvorak** gained a two-round total of 95 points to lead the team as **George Roat**, **James Byrd** and **Nico Donaldson** also contributed to the team's success. Last year, Isleworth edged out Lake Jovita G & CC by one stroke for the 2006 title. Dvorak and Roat were members of that winning team as Byrd and Donaldson are new to the team this year. **Rio Pinar Country Club**, in Orlando, finished 13 points back from the Champions with a 231 total for second place while **Redlands Golf and Country Club**, in Homestead, jumped into third place with 123 points in the final round. With 107 in the first round, Redlands finished with a total of 230.

New for 2007, each team member played 36 holes of individual stroke play using stableford scoring. The total of the best three point totals of four count as the team score for each day with the high team point total for 36 holes crowned the Champion.

After the first round, the pair led the field by one stroke shooting a 63. O'Keefe, of Fort Lauderdale, and Babusik, from Pompano Beach, posted a 68 in the final round to win the Championship with a 131 tournament total. The Temple Terrace duo of **Kim Schwencke** and **Don Whittemore** placed second two strokes back from the Champions. Schwencke and Whittemore carded a 70 in the first round and jumped ahead with a final round 63.

Whose Turn Is It, Anyway?

G e n e r a l l y speaking, the ball farther from the hole goes first, right? Well, not always. And who goes off the tee first? Let's

find out.

Rule 10 covers Order of Play but there sometimes are some tricky situations.

Let's start with the teeing ground. The player or side that is to play first from the tee is said to have the honor. In organized competitions, the honor is decided by the draw done by the Committee as listed on the starter's sheet. In the absence of a draw, the honor is decided by lot. That means flipping a coin or tee or a similar method you want to use.

As for the remaining tees in match play, the side that wins the hole takes the honor at the next teeing ground. If the hole was halved, the side that had the honor at the previous tee retains it. In stroke play, the competitor with the lowest score at a hole takes the honor at the next tee. The competitor with the next lowest score plays next and so on. If two or more tie, their order from the previous tee is retained.

A net competition where handicaps are used throws in an added wrinkle. In match play, the side with the low net score from the previous hole has the honor. In stroke play, you use the gross score to determine the honor since the handicap is applied at the end of the round.

Team competitions can also add a twist. For instance, in four-ball play where two partners both play their own ball individually, it is the side farthest from the hole that should play first but they may play in any order they wish. Let's say I lay three and I have a tap in for a par four while my partner has a twenty-five foot birdie putt. As long as it's our turn to play (our side is away), I can go ahead and tap in my putt for four and then let my partner have a run at it for birdie from twenty-five feet.

Here's a strange one for you. You and I while playing individually both hit our approach shots into a water hazard fronting the green. The option I choose has me dropping my ball 90 yards from the hole but your option results in you to dropping yours 85 yards from the hole. Is it my turn to play since I'm away? Not necessarily. In this case the order of play is determined by the position where both balls ended up in the hazard; not where we dropped. If mine ended up ten yards from the hole but yours ended up fifteen yards from the hole in the water hazard; it's your turn to play even though you are closer after the drop. (See Decision 10/2)

I guess whose turn it is to play is not so cut and dry!

Remember, knowing and following the Rules of Golf can assist you in avoiding unnecessary penalties and help you to enjoy this great game of golf even more.

Go ahead; it's your turn to play.

Floridians Advance to USGA National Championships


Florida golfers were well represented this year qualifying for many USGA National Championships. **Jeff Golden** and **Chris Condello**, two of Florida's finest amateurs, advanced to the 2007 U.S. Open Championship from Sectional Qualifying at **Jupiter Hills Club**. **Vicky Hurst** earned medalist honors while **Alexis Thompson** and **Nicole Hage** also

secured their spot from Sectional Qualifying at **Heathrow Country Club** to move on to the U.S. Women's Open Championship.

Jeff Golden, 22, of Winter Park, went wire-to-wire to earn medalist and low amateur honors posting a tournament total of 142 at Jupiter Hills. Chris Condello, 21, of Heathrow, secured his spot in the U.S. Open after winning a playoff on the first hole.

Vicky Hurst, 16, from Melbourne, topped the sectional field for the second consecutive year after posting a tournament total of 5-under par 137. In the first round, Hurst made five birdies and eagled the 11th hole to card a 6-under par 65 and lead the field by four. Hurst, last year's U.S. Girls Junior runner-up, recorded a 72 in the final round to maintain the lead and win by two. Alexis Thompson, 12, from Coral Springs, also advanced to the U.S. Women's Open firing consistent rounds of 72-71—143 to become the youngest to ever qualify for the U.S. Women's Open. Thompson and Hurst are FJT members and have won multiple events on the Tour. Fellow Floridian, Nicole Hage, of Coral Springs, secured a qualifying spot after making birdie on the first playoff hole.

The North team claimed the 2nd Junior Florida Cup at Calusa Pines Golf Club in Naples earning 29 points to the South team's 11 points.

After the first day of the Junior Florida Cup, the North team had a commanding nine point lead gaining 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ points to the South's 5 $\frac{1}{2}$. The North team gained seven points in the morning round of four-ball compared to the South's three points. In the afternoon round of mixed foursomes, the North team remained in front earning 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ points to the South's 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ points.

On the final day of singles matches, the North team matched their first day total of 14 ½ points while the South gained 5 ½ points. In all, the North team had nine players go undefeated for the tournament. Top-ranked Blayne Barber defeated Joshua Leppo 2 and 1 while Meghan Chapman, second on the division points list, won her match 4 and 3 for the North team. The first morning, each boy and girl is paired with a partner to compete in a four-ball match. In the afternoon round, the boys and girls are paired together to play mixed-foursomes matches. The final day each player competes in a singles match against a player from the opposing team. Points are awarded to each match similarly to the Ryder Cup to determine the winning team. Last year, the inaugural Junior Florida Cup ended in a tie with each team earning 20 points.


