Gardner & Koch Win Four-Ball Championship

52 Teams Compete at TwinEagles

Ben Gardner and Phil Koch, students at Florida Atlantic University, took home the title of the Florida State Four-Ball Championship on July 20. The Club at TwinEagles in Naples, a fantastic Jack Nicklaus design, hosted the 41st Four-Ball Championship.

Gardner, 18, and Koch, 21, of Boca Raton, fired a 65 in the first round, the low round of the day. On the second day, they continued to lead recording a 68 to win by one stroke with a two-day total of 133, 11-under par. Gardner and Koch went into the 18th hole thinking they needed to make birdie to win, par for a playoff, but really a par would clinch the Championship. After Gardner hit into the water on #18, Koch found the green in regulation and two-putted for par to win the Championship. Koch says "I redeemed myself on 18 after missing a four foot putt on the 17th hole for birdie."

Tied for second place were **Brent Bush**, of Palm Beach Gardens, and **Vince Cherrix**, of Pompano Beach, and the team of **Bill Harvey**, of Palm City, and **John Sanford**, of Jupiter. Both teams shot a 134 two-day total, one off the pace. Four teams finished with a 135 including the team of **Randy Briggs** and **Daniel Owen**. Briggs and Owen were tied for second

after the first day when Briggs eagled the 18th hole. A total of 38 teams shot par or better, 144 for the two days.

Defending Champion **David Sutton** playing with new partner, **John Corzilius**, carded a 68-70 to finish with a 138 total. The Mid-Amateur Four-Ball South Champions, **Juan** and **Julio Nutt**, of Miami, recorded a 137, four back from the champions.

The Four-Ball Championship featured 52 teams of two playing 36 holes of four-ball stroke play over two days. Forty-two teams qualified through one of the seven qualifying events and the other ten teams earned exempt status through one of five categories.

The Club at TwinEagles, site of the Champions Tour event, the ACE Group Classic will also host the **Florida State Amateur Championship** in 2004.

Elliot Wins Inaugural Junior Match Play At Lake Nona

The Florida State Junior Match Play Invitational at Lake Nona Golf Club in Orlando had to wait about an hour and a half to find out its champion, but after the weather turned brighter, the two final matches continued and the champions were crowned.

The finals in the Match Play Invitational featured Jason Elliott versus Jacob **Davidson**, two of the top juniors in the state. Elliott, 17, of Palm Harbor, defeated Davidson, only 15, from Jacksonville, 4 and 2. Both advanced to the Championship finals after winning their semifinal match 1 up. Elliot, who finished 10th in the Junior State Championship, won his first two matches 1 up and 6-5 while making 11 birdies in 31 holes. Davidson, 15, won his first two matches in 28 holes winning each 5-4 with four birdies for the day.

Jhared Hack, 13, of Orlando, outlasted eight other golfers to win the junior division in the Match Play Championship. Hack, of Orlando, defeated Kyle Cobb, 14, of Tallahassee, 1 up. Hack, the Junior State Runner-Up in the junior division, won his semi-final round 3 and 2 as Cobb moved on to the finals after winning 5 and 4. The first day featured Hack winning his match 3 and 2 and Cobb won on the last hole 1 up.

This first-ever Junior Match Play invitational was a competitive event for the top juniors in the state in a match play format. The regular division, ages 15-17, featured nine of the top 15 finishers from the 2003 Florida State Junior Championship as well as seven more juniors based on their performance throughout the year. The junior division, ages 12-14 was made up of eight of the top 12 finishers from the State Junior Championship junior division.

Proven the success of this event, it will be back again next year!

Not even ten miles away at The Bay Hill Club plays Arnold Palmer's grandson, Sam Saunders. Just like his grandfather, Sam is known to have big, strong hands.

Sam, 15, became the youngest club champion at Bay Hill when he won the title by eight strokes on a cold January day. Sam and Mr. Palmer often work together on the range and play together. Sam competes in many AJGA, FJGA and FCWT events where he recently won two FCWT Championships (Future Collegiate World Tour). Coming up, Sam is preparing for the Western Amateur. As he spends time with his family this summer on the East coast, he continues to practice and play tournaments. Bay Hill Pro, Brian Dorn, says Sam, "is one of the best kids you'll ever meet." "He's very humble and well mannered; his parents did a great job raising him.."

Mid-Amateur Championship Preview

The road to the **Florida State Mid-Amateur Championship** will begin on September 4 with eight qualifiers across the state. The Championship will play at **Emerald Dunes Golf Course** in West Palm Beach on October 2-5 with the entry deadline being August 13.

To be eligible for the State Mid-Amateur, participants must be 25 years of age or older as of October 2, 2003 and a member of the FSGA. Players will attempt to qualify at eight sites in an 18 hole stroke play format. The Championship consists of 36 holes of stroke play qualifying over the first two days with the lowest 16 advancing to match play on Saturday and Sunday.

Last year at the **Country Club of Ocala**, **David Anthony**, of Jacksonville, defeated **Ken Moody**, of Ponte Vedra Beach, 1 up, to win the title. Anthony and Moody receive exempt status into this year's championship.



I'm Deemed To Have What?

How many times have you heard this before?

"I lined up my putt and just before I made my stroke the wind blew causing the ball to move - and

you're telling me it's my fault?"

It happens to the best of them; including Phil Mickelson at this year's British Open Championship.

The Rules of Golf cover this very specific occurrence. You can find it in Rule 18-2b; Ball at Rest Moved-Ball Moving after Address.

Two important definitions are involved - "move or moved" and "addressing the ball."

First, a ball is deemed to have "moved" when it leaves its position and comes to rest in any other place.

Secondly, a player has "addressed the ball" when he has taken his stance and has also grounded his club, except that in a hazard a player has addressed the ball when he has taken his stance.

The Rule states that "if a player's ball in play moves after he has addressed it (other than as a result of a stroke), the player shall be deemed to have moved the ball and shall incur a penalty stroke. The player shall replace the ball unless the movement of the ball occurs after he has begun his swing and he does not discontinue his swing."

In Phil Mickelson's case, while on a putting green, he took his stance and grounded his club; both of those circumstances must be present (except in a hazard). When the ball moved thereafter, he was deemed to have caused the ball to move and not

the wind. Thus the one shot penalty and he had to replace the ball. Now that may seem somewhat penal but think of the discussions of "what caused the ball to move" there may be if this Rule were not in existence. There certainly could be many reasons brought forth by many players besides themselves causing it to move. Instead, this Rule says that the player caused it to move, add one penalty stroke, replace the ball and get back to playing golf.

How can you get around that? Well, Jack Nicklaus was known to frequently not address the ball. He simply did not ground the club. Rather, he would hover the club slightly off the ground and therefore never address the ball.

Remember, it pays to know the Rules. Knowing the Rules of Golf can help you save strokes and enjoy the game of golf.



USGA and other benevolent golf agencies operating in Florida. Our hope was to partner with an existing golf facility and we had extensive, yet unsuccessful discussions with Disney, the PGA in Port St. Lucie and the proposed TPC/ Lake Nona project.

The golf industry is in a period where many courses are being sold at prices well below their replacement cost and as our volunteers (nearly 400) and it would serve as a rotational site for a many of our championships and qualifiers. Golf House would also become the headquarters for junior golf in Florida and home to the FSGA Hall of Fame.

Several other state golf associations own a golf facility and this may be an excellent time for the FSGA to find a perThank you,
