USGA Qualifiers Get Underway

The Championship season is in full swing and that means USGA Qualifiers are also just beginning. With the help of our Tournament Chairmen and Committee Members, we successfully conducted all 17 U.S. Open local qualifiers for the 110th U.S. Open. Florida continues to conduct the most qualifiers in the country. More than 9,000 entries were received for the 110th Championship. The FSGA will also conduct one of the 15 sectional qualifiers at McArthur Golf Club in Hobe Sound on June 7. In all, the FSGA will conduct over 40 qualifying events for USGA Championships in 2010.



FJT Season Wraps Up

The Florida Junior Tour concludes its season at the end of this month with the final events at Orange County National and Harmony Golf Preserve May 29-31. This year has been a great success, and we are already looking forward to next season.

More than 700 juniors signed up for membership for the 2009-2010 season. This season featured 23 events that included the best juniors in the state of Florida. Next season will feature an expanded schedule with events continuing into the summer months in addition to our Junior Championship schedule.

Recent Rulings on the Course

Have you ever had your ball end up in such a bad lie that you couldn't play it as it lies?

Of course you have! That's a part of golf and we should all know what our options are the next time it happens on the golf course.


This occurrence is covered by Rule 28; Ball Unplayable.

Here are a couple things to remember about an unplayable ball.

- 1. The player may deem his ball unplayable at any place on the course, except when the ball is in a water hazard. (If your ball is in a water hazard, you may be able to play it as it lies or you must proceed under the Water Hazard Rule Rule 26)
- 2. The player is the sole judge as to whether his ball is unplayable.
- 3. When proceeding under this Rule, the player may lift and clean his ball or substitute a ball.

If the player deems his ball to be unplayable, he has three options, all under penalty of one stroke:

a. Play a ball as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was last played (see Rule 20-5). This is the stroke and distance option that is always available to a player. If your last stroke was made from the teeing ground, you could once again play from the teeing ground. If it was last made from the fairway, you would be dropping back in the fairway; or





yardage, say that of a wedge, and drop the ball on that imaginary line. Remember, you don't get to drop two club-lengths either side of the line rather directly on that imaginary line; or

c. Drop a ball within two club-lengths of the spot where the ball lay, but not nearer the hole. This is probably the most often used option. Remember, drop a ball within two club-lengths of where the original ball lies, not from the edge of the junk your ball lies within.

And don't forget that when your ball is plugged up under the lip of a bunker, you can still use this Rule. If the unplayable ball is in a bunker, the player may proceed under options a, b or c above. If you are a lousy bunker player like I am, option a will have you dropping back outside the bunker as long as your last stroke was made from outside the bunker. If you elect to proceed under options b or c, a ball must be dropped in the bunker.

Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

- 18 holes of individual net stroke play within flights
- Players will play to 100% of their course handicap
- Shotgun start

Flights and Tees Played

- "Under 50" Flight Approximately 6,500 yards
- "50-64" Flight Approximately 6,200 yards
- "65 and Over" Flight Approximately 6,000 yards

- All entries must be received through the FSGA website
- Groupings and hole assignments will be posted approximately 3 days before the event
- Results will be posted through the FSGA website

Prizes

- \$10 per man (from the entry fee) is in the gift certificate pot
- Ties will be broken by scorecard playoff. First by comparing the back nine, if still tied, then the last 6 holes on the course, then the last three, then the 18th hole and finally by a coin flip.
- Payouts within flights the number of players earning gift certificates and the amounts will be based on the number of players in each flight that week.

Tournament Uniform Policy Change Jim Demick, Executive Director

Short Pants - i.e. How Ugly are Your Legs??? Male Tournament officials, beginning June 1st, through the end of September, are permitted to wear short pants when officiating at most events. Now, this is Demick speaking, so please hear me out and take my comments with the <u>humor intended</u>:

- 1. **Short Specifications** Khaki shorts may be worn BUT they must be good looking golf shorts that fit well! No cargo pants and make sure the shorts are long enough for any country club. If your shorts are too tight or too short buy new ones or wear long pants.
- 2. **Socks & Shoes** Your should wear short white socks with golf shoes or clean sneakers. (Golf Shoes are preferred) We do not want to look like miss-placed tourists walking around our member clubs!! No high socks or clunky shoes. Make sure you look good.
- 3. **Legs** No matter how good looking your shorts are if your legs are in the bottom 20% of the class we may have a problem. Be honest with yourself if you legs are too big, too soft, too white, or just questionable maybe long pants would be better.
- 4. **Exceptions** Long pants continue to be required for all FSGA staff and officials when serving as Tournament Chairmen. Shorts can be worn when setting up a course in advance of a competition but not on the day of the competition.
- 5. **Long Pants Required at Certain Events** Long pants are required at the Florida Open, the US Open Sectional and the State Amateur.
