Tournament Uniform Policy Jim Demick, Executive Director

Short Pants - i.e. How Ugly are Your Legs??? Male Tournament officials, beginning June 1st, through the end of September, are permitted to wear short pants when officiating at most events. Now, this is Demick speaking, so please hear me out and take my comments with the <u>humor intended</u>:

- 1. **Short Specifications** Khaki shorts may be worn BUT they must be good looking golf shorts that fit well! No cargo pants and make sure the shorts are long enough for any country club. If your shorts are too tight or too short buy new ones or wear long pants.
- 2. **Socks & Shoes** You should wear short white socks with golf shoes or clean sneakers. (Golf Shoes are preferred) We do not want to look like miss-placed tourists walking around our member clubs!! No high socks or clunky shoes. Make sure you look good.
- 3. **Legs** No matter how good looking your shorts are if your legs are in the bottom 20% of the class we may have a problem. Be honest with yourself if you legs are too big, too soft, too white, or just questionable maybe long pants would be better.
- 4. **Exceptions** Long pants continue to be required for all FSGA staff and officials when serving as Tournament Chairmen. Shorts can be worn when setting up a course in advance of a competition but not on the day of the competition.
- 5. **Long Pants Required at Certain Events** Long pants are required at the Florida Open, the US Open Sectional and the State Amateur.

Rules & Competition

Who's in Charge of this Event?

The Committee is in charge!

Have you ever wondered who decides when, where, what time, what form of play and all of those other conditions that are needed to form a competition? That is the job of the Committee.

"What is a committee," you ask?

By definition according to the Rules of Golf, "the 'Committee' is the committee in charge of the competition or, if the matter does not arise in a competition, the committee in charge of the course."

The Committee may have many people such as the U.S. Open Championship Committee for the U.S. Open Championship or as few as your local golf professional for a one day club event.

The Committee has many responsibilities as outlined in Rule 33 in the Rules of Golf book. Those responsibilities include laying down the conditions under which the competition is to be played as well as ensuring the course is properly defined, marked and prepared for the event. Also, the Committee is charged with arranging the starting times and, in stroke play, arranging the groups in which the competitors will play. Additionally, publishing a handicap stroke table in net events, issuing score cards in stroke play events, and announcing the manner in which ties are to be decided are all responsibilities of the Committee. Finally, the Committee is charged with making and publishing Local Rules for abnormal conditions. However, in all cases, the Committee's authority is limited in that it has no power to waive a Rule of Golf.



I know many of you may have spent little time reading through Rule 33 in the Rules of Golf book. Take a moment and look through some of the available sample Local Rules in Appendix I that a Committee may implement in a competition. Remember, none of these Local Rules are in effect until the Committee implements them in the competition!

If you are selected or appointed as a member of the Committee, Rule 33 is required reading along with Appendix I in the back of the Rule book. I would also strongly recommend obtaining a copy of "How to Conduct a Competition" published by the USGA and available through their website at www.usga.org.

A job well done by the Committee will make the competition run smoothly and head off many questions or problems that may arise. It will also make for a fun and fair event under the Rules of Golf and a more enjoyable time.

And by the way, in special situations, the Rules of Golf also authorize the Committee to waive, modify or impose a penalty of disqualification if the Committee considers such action warranted; just in case you wanted to know who was in charge!

Entry Fee

- Includes: Cart, golf, range balls and prizes.
- Prices range from \$40-\$95.

Format

- 18 holes of individual net stroke play within flights
- Players will play to 100% of their course handicap
- Shotgun start

Flights and Tees Played

- "Under 50" Flight Approximately 6,500 yards
- "50-64" Flight Approximately 6,200 yards
- "65 and Over" Flight Approximately 6,000 yards

Entries, Tee Times, Results and Details

- All entries must be received through the FSGA website
- Groupings and hole assignments will be posted approximately 3 days before the event
- Results will be posted through the FSGA website

Prizes

- \$10 per man (from the entry fee) is in the gift certificate pot
- Ties will be broken by scorecard playoff. First by comparing the back nine, if still tied, then the last 6 holes on the course, then the last three, then the 18th hole and finally by a coin flip.
- Payouts within flights the number of players earning gift certificates and the amounts will be based on the number of players in each flight that week.
