One Club-Length or Two?

Many times I have been asked this very simple question for which there is not a simple answer.

"Do you drop it within one club-length when there is no penalty and within two club-lengths when there is?"

The answer to this question is the same answer to many questions on the Rules of Golf; it depends.

I believe the best way to answer this question is to answer the two clublength side of the question first. If you are dropping a ball within two club-lengths of a spot, than you are operating under a <u>penalty situation</u>. It may be under one of the options of the Water Hazard Rule (Rule 26) or the Unplayable Ball Rule (Rule 28). Whichever it is, if you are dropping it within two club-lengths of a reference point, you are paying the piper one-penalty stroke.

On the other side of the question is "when you are operating under a non-penalty situation, do you drop it within one club-length of a reference point?" And once again, the answer is that it depends on the situation.

For instance, if you are taking relief for a <u>non-penalty situation</u> from a puddle of casual water or ground under repair (Rule 25-1), a cart path (Rule 24-2b) or a wrong putting green (Rule 25-3) when your ball lay

either through the green or in a hazard (and even sometimes on the teeing ground), you will be dropping within one clublength of a reference point.

If you are taking <u>relief without penalty</u> for a ball embedded in its own pitch mark through the green (Rule 25-2), you will <u>not be dropping within one club-length</u>; rather you will be dropping as near as possible to a spot.

This weird and wacky code of Rules has many strange twists and turns. Sometimes you are dropping nowhere near where your ball lies such as back where you last played (Rule 20-5 for Rules 26-1a, 27-1 or 28a). Yet other times it may be as near as possible to an imaginary line (Rule 26-1b, 24-2b(ii)(b), 25-1b(ii)(b) or 28b. And don't forget the three already mentioned above: within two club-lengths, one club-length and as near as possible to a spot.

No wonder they need people like us to help them on the golf course!

Entry Fee

- Includes: Cart, golf, range balls and prizes.
- Prices range from \$40-\$95.

Format

- 18 holes of individual net stroke play within flights
- Players will play to 100% of their course handicap
- Shotgun start

Flights and Tees Played

- "Under 50" Flight Approximately 6,500 yards
- "50-64" Flight Approximately 6,200 yards
- "65 and Over" Flight Approximately 6,000 yards

Entries, Tee Times, Results and Details

- All entries must be received through the FSGA website
- Groupings and hole assignments will be posted approximately 3 days before the event
- Results will be posted through the FSGA website

Prizes

- \$10 per man (from the entry fee) is in the gift certificate pot
- Ties will be broken by scorecard playoff. First by comparing the back nine, if still tied, then the last 6 holes on the course, then the last three, then the 18th hole and finally by a coin flip.
- Payouts within flights the number of players earning gift certificates and the amounts will be based on the number of players in each flight that week.

Eligibility

- Male, amateur golfers
- FSGA/GHIN handicap required (24.0 or less)
- Golfers who do not have a FSGA/GHIN handicap index from a FSGA member club may purchase a 2010 handicap online for \$30 at www.fsga.org.
- First time players without an established GHIN handicap will be eligible to compete, but not for prizes.

Innisbrook – Island Course

Hello Course Raters,

As you might be aware, there are quite a number of courses requesting ratings after renovating their courses. Preferably these ratings are scheduled after the course has opened for play, but more often than not, the club wants the rating to appear on their new scorecards. Thus the course is rated when it is growing in. This fact disturbs me because, does the club want an accurate rating or do they want "a number" for their scorecard? The latter seems to be the answer for most clubs. Lately, it seems as though I am constantly selling the benefits of waiting until the course is ready to play before rating, which stacks the odds in our favor for an accurate measurement and rating. If the club is unwilling to wait,



regrettably we have to rate the course at the time they wish to have it rated. Given that the state of Florida has two competing golf associations, we have to try and educate our member clubs to what the best course of action would be, and when that doesn't work, give them what they want. We don't want to lose a member club to GAF because we didn't give the club a rating. If you have any questions on how to handle this situation, please feel free to give me a call.
