

How many times have you observed someone looking for their ball reach down and pick up a ball to see if it is theirs? I bet it's been a bunch of times. Sometimes they won't even get out of the cart; just sort of give it the foot wedge to roll it over!

That may be what common sense tells us to do, but let's see what the Rules of Golf tell us we <u>must</u> do.

Rule 12-2, Identifying Ball, is the applicable Rule. It tells us what to do when we find it necessary to lift a ball to identify it. This Rule spells out very specific actions a player must take in order to lift a ball. Remember, the Rules do not want you to lift your ball just any old time. With the privilege of lifting your ball, other than on the putting green, come some responsibilities. Let's see what they are.

- 1. Before lifting the ball, the player must announce his intention to lift the ball to his opponent in match play or his marker or a fellow-competitor in stroke play.
- 2. Before lifting the ball, he must mark its position
- 3. Before lifting the ball, the player must give his opponent, marker or a fellow-competitor the opportunity to observe the lifting

"Hey Pete, I think this is my ball. I put a tee down behind it and I'm going to lift it to see if it's mine. Do you want to watch me?"

"Nah, go ahead Tom, I trust you."



Tom may now go ahead and lift the ball to see if it his ball or a stray ball. If he cannot tell if it is his due to mud, grass or some other material adhering to the ball, he may clean it only to the extent necessary to identify it.

If it's not his ball, he may disregard and keep looking. If it turns out to be Tom's ball, he must replace it to its original position. However, he has one more action he must take before replacing his ball.

4. He must allow his opponent, marker or a fellow-competitor the opportunity to observe the replacement.

"Hey Pete, it's mine. Do you want to watch me put it back?"

"Yea Tom, I'd better since I've got five bucks riding on this and I know it must have been sitting down pretty deep in that rough!"

If Tom had failed to comply with all or any one of these four requirements, he incurs a one-stroke penalty total; not one penalty stroke for each one he forgot.



Remember, use the index or the table of contents to find the correct Rule that applies to the situation and follow the Rules of Golf to help yourself to enjoy the game of golf.

Entry Fee

• Includes: Cart, golf, range balls, and prizes.

Format

- 18 holes of individual net stroke play within flights, unless you choose to play in the **Gross flight**.
- Players will play to 100% of their course handicap
- Shotgun start

Flights and Tees Played

- Gross Flight (All Ages) Approximately 6,500 yards
- Under 50 Flight Approximately 6,500 yards
- 50-64 Flight Approximately 6,200 yards
- 65 and Over Flight Approximately 6,000 yards
- Women's Flight Approximately 5,200 yards



Entries, Tee Times, Results, and Details

- All entries must be received through the FSGA website. **Except for TPC Sawgrass**
- Groupings and hole assignments will be posted approximately 3 days before the event.
- Results will be posted through the FSGA website.

Prizes

- \$10 per person (from the entry fee) is in the gift certificate pool.
- Payouts within flights the number of players earning gift certificates and the amounts will be based on the number of players in each flight that week.

Eligibility

- Amateur golfers (Women are eligible for select events in each region).
- FSGA/GHIN handicap required (24.0 or less).
- Golfers who do not have a FSGA/GHIN handicap index from a FSGA member club may purchase a 2011 handicap online for \$30 at www.fsga.org.
- First time players without an established GHIN handicap will be eligible to compete, but not for prizes.

Course Rating Update

Hello Raters,

How's your summer going? I know many of you are very busy with ratings and I truly appreciate all of your hard work. This month I would like to discuss some procedural issues we need to iron out. I would appreciate some input about the Skycaddie GSX.

When submitting a rating to the office, in the body of the email, please indicate if the club has any combo tees that I need to compute. Also, please confirm with the club that the team has rated all necessary tees. Many times this summer, I have calculated ratings and printed certificates for a club, only to receive a call inquiring about a missing tee for men or women. Please make sure all tees are accounted for. If combo tees and/or other tees need to be calculated by making a yardage adjustment, please include a note in the body of the email regarding these calculations.

A golf professional at a club in Fort Myers measured his course with a Skycaddie GSX prior to my arrival. I, of course, told him his measurements could not be used because they were not done to USGA standards. When I finished measuring, I was very surprised by the results. We had an overall difference of 2 yards. Currently, I am looking into the procedure Skycaddie uses when measuring each course to see if this is a viable option for our rating teams. I think using the Skycaddie GSX could make everyone's job a lot easier. Please let me know if you have any experience with this device. We need to figure out if this is a fluke or not.
