Recent Rulings on the Course

The following interesting scenario regarding a provisional ball was recently relayed to me. Play is in groups of three in stroke play. Both individual and team events are being played concurrently.

Player A hit his tee shot toward an area of heavy brush and trees. Fearing his ball may be lost outside of a water hazard, he properly informs his marker (Player B) and fellow competitor (Player C) that he will play a provisional ball. However, both the original and the provisional ball are of the same model and number and neither have an identifying mark applied by the player.

The player hits his provisional ball toward the same area but not quite as deep into the brush. The players proceed toward the area of which the balls are presumed to have come to rest. Upon reaching the area, a ball



is found of the same brand, model and number played. Player A advises the other players that it is his original ball. Players B and C disagree, stating that the ball recovered was the provisional ball since it was observed to come to rest short of the brush.

Player A claims that the ball found is the original ball because he can distinguish it from the provisional ball due to the wear marks on the ball and it may have bounced out of the trees into the area of the second ball. He claims the provisional ball was brand new and had no such wear marks.

This is a tough call. Player A should have applied an identifying mark on his ball as suggested by the Rules of Golf. By not doing so, he is required to provide proof of which ball is which. By not allowing the other players to see the provisional ball, he gets strike two and digs a deeper hole.

Decision 12-2/1 gives us some guidance in this case. It states that the player may be able to distinguish the ball by the condition of the ball. However, if another ball of the same brand, model and identification number is lying in the same area and either ball from a condition standpoint could be the player's ball, the player may not assume the found ball to be his original. From the evidence and testimony of the players, the Committee decided that the found ball cannot be identified as neither the original nor the provisional.

As a result of not being able to identify the ball, Decision 27/11 becomes applicable and the third situation now becomes applicable. Since the found ball may not be positively identified, it must be presumed to be the provisional ball.

Remember that a provisional ball is meant to save time and not to trap players into penalties. Take a moment and read through the provisional ball Rule and help save time and improve pace of play on the course and contribute to a more enjoyable round of golf for everyone.

Course Rating Update

Hello Course Raters,

The USGA has released their new online Course Rating Program, and of course with any new piece of software, it has its share of bugs, mainly due to the fact we use the summary entry method to generate ratings. Another bug is the way the ratings need to be entered. A vital component of the program still doesn't work, so I have to create a new tee and once I complete the rating, I need to delete the existing tee and rename the new one. This is very time consuming. You may also notice that the rating summary sheets that I send out may have rating numbers a little different than what your workbook generates. I was assured by the USGA, that the behind the scenes calculations with the new program are more accurate than the old program and there will be differences. So don't be too alarmed when you see these differences. One advantage of the new Course Rating Program is because it's online, I can set-up user accounts, which will give the captains the ability to login and look over existing ratings. I think this is a huge benefit for the teams for future ratings. If you are interested and are a captain, please email me to set-up an account at **gdonat@fsga.org.**

I have noticed lately a number of ratings coming in without tee designations and dates. I need to have the correct tee designations included with every rating. This is a basic component of the rating and without it, we just delay the process. Another basic component would be the date the course was rated. This information is essential to the process so please do not leave it out.


