As we approach our "busy season", we thought we'd update you on our progress thus far in 2006. We've had a very successful rating season so far with 100 men's ratings completed and 85 women's ratings completed.

We're also in the process of undergoing a massive reorganization of all the office course rating files. We are currently digitizing each club file to our main server as a backup and to allow online viewing of the files. Not only does this protect us from theft or loss, but it will also allow us to streamline the entire rating process. This process will allow us to make available to the Captain/Co-Captain, through the website, the two most recent rating workbooks and/or Form 1's. Basically, we're scanning all paper Form 1's from existing ratings and moving current Excel workbooks to individual club folders on our server. When and only a club requests a new rating, this "old" information will be accessible for the Captain if he or she needs it.

We're also working on the much promised "online course rating request form". Our goal is to allow any course requesting a rating to do so through our website electronically. Once completed, the website will automatically forward a request to the Captain as well as add it to your online rating schedule. We feel this will not only provide a much more efficient service to the member club but also allows us to instantly send the request to the rating captain, thus eliminating "slow mail" as Mr. Robideau calls it. Many thanks to our I.T. Manager Patrick Melton for expediting the process. Hope all of you had a great summer, and we look forward to seeing you at a Volunteer Appreciation Day!

Stay with your Group!

Everyone knows about the Rule that says that you have to be at the tee on time and ready to play. But what about the second half of that Rule?

Rule 6-3b says that "In stroke play, the competitor must remain throughout the round in the group arranged by the Committee unless the Committee authorizes or ratifies a change."

In a recent Championship played in groups of three, two consecutive groups ended up as twosomes as a result of a withdrawal and a no show. Part way through the round, they found themselves waiting to play and thought that if they joined together as a foursome, they could speed up play for themselves and the following groups. Their intention was good but it resulted in a breach of Rule 6-3b and the associated severe penalty of disqualification.

Giving back to the game

foursome of Villagers have stepped up to the tee and taken their love of golf to the next level as volunteers for the Florida State Golf Association.

Scrib Kelly, Neil Dufresne, Mike Lonergan and Len Veraldi gear up for days at a time to rate courses and help run FSGA-sanctioned tournaments throughout the state.

"We volunteer during the tournaments," Kelly said. "We handle registration, work as starters, we help set up the course, serve as rules officials, and enforce pace of play."

"We're trained to do all the jobs," Lonergan said. "We get moved around the tournament as they need us."

"We never know what we are doing until we get to the tournament," Kelly said.

All of the volunteers take a one-day course to bring them up to speed on the basics of volunteering. They agreed that the most daunting part of their training is mastering the arcana known as the "Rules of Golf."

"To be a rules official, you take a one-day course first. That's to see if you can stand the five-day course," Kelly joked.

"We can handle most of the routine questions ourselves," Dufresne said. "If we have a serious question, we have radios on the course and can contact one of those guys who got a 100 on the rules test."

Kidding aside, all three agreed that any golfer who enjoys the game would already be well prepared to volunteer. That sentiment was echoed by Jim Demick, the FSGA's executive director. Demick said that FSGA currently has 400 volunteers.

"We're looking for new people to bring along," Demick said. "We have volunteers of all skill levels. Golfers of all backgrounds and skill levels can help out. All the volunteers like golf, and like giving back to the game."

"Most of the training is on the job," Lonergan said, "and you have clearly written responsibilities."

In order to do all those jobs, the Villagers have to get up early enough to be at the tournament site by 7 a.m., or travel to training sessions. Depending on the distance, they may spend the night away from home, but there are compensations.

"There's a lot of travel, but you get to see a lot of courses that are strictly private; courses you'd never otherwise see," Kelly said.

"It's so much fun to see the courses and tournaments. You see players coming up, and players who put you in awe," Dufresne said.

Another job volunteers do, Demick said, is rate courses.

"A course rater spends a full day on a course, doing a lot of measurements and scientific statistical analysis," Demick said, explaining that ratings allow handicaps to be standardized.

Kelly found the FSGA by accident.

"I was on the Internet looking into getting my handicap, when I saw the link on the FSGA Web site for volunteers," Kelly said. "It looked like fun, and I have the time."

"I had made a commitment to get involved in volunteer activities when I retired," Lonergan said. "I met Neil and Scrib in a golf tournament and decided to look into it.

"I absolutely love the game," Lonergan continued. "It reflects life, and unless we support the game and make it better, golf will not grow."

Without volunteers, Kelly said, the FSGA would not be able to hold sanctioned tournaments, especially the junior events that qualify up-and-coming golfers for national competition.

"Depending on the tournament, it takes six to eight volunteers for a tournament of 100 players," Kelly said.

"This is huge," Lonergan said. "The junior tournaments are what Tiger (Woods) was doing while he was growing up. We run 15 junior events annually for golfers 13-18 years old. It's the only way any golfer can progress to national tournaments."

Lonergan estimated that there are about 800 players in the junior program, and he added that the FSGA also sponsors tournaments and a variety of championships for players of all ages. He said the FSGA sponsors 134 tournaments, which adds up to 250 days per year of competition.
