Burns Easily Wins State Junior Title

Robb Burns of Lake City fired his second straight 68 for a 136 total Friday and an easy four-stroke victory in the Florida State Golf Association Junior Championship at Fox-fire Golf Club.

Burns outdistanced Adam Armagost of North Palm Beach and first-round co-leader Warren Smith of Melbourne with his total, eight under par for 36 holes over the par-72 course. Smith, who matched Burns' 68 in the first round Thursday, finished with an even-par 72 Friday for a 140. Armagost followed a 71 Thursday with a three-under par 69 to tie Smith for second place in the 15-17-year-old division.

Tim Fieldhouse of Sarasota captured the 12-14 age group title when he added a 74 to his first-round 72 for a 146 total, seven strokes ahead of Lake Placid's Kevin Dyer. Bill Galvano of Bradenton, just one shot behind Fieldhouse after Thursday's round, skied to an 87 Friday and finished in fourth place at 160.

The top 10 overall finishers in the tournament qualified for a tri-state challenge match against juniors from South Carolina and Georgia, to be played in Aiken, S.C., June 26 and 27.

Florida's traveling team consists of Burns, Smith, Armagost, Fieldhouse, Bill Byrne of Orlando, George McCoy of Bartow, Rich Etscorn of Orlando, Bob Bishop of Vero Beach, Bradenton's Joe King, and Steve Greek of Keystone Heights.

Greek, who opened the tournament with a 77, bounced back to a three-under-par 69 Friday to make the 146 cutoff needed to qualify for the tri-state match.

Former Sarasotan John Strauss turned in a 142 total for the tournament but will be

unable to compete in South Carolina. The Winter Springs resident fired rounds of 72 and 70 for the tourney, good for fifth place overall.

Gregg Gamester also qualified with a 144 but he too has other commitments.

"I made some putts," said Burns, who had only one bogey Friday. "My putting was the difference in the tournament."

Burns birdied the fifth, seventh and eighth on the front nine Friday and after suffering a bogey on 10 he rebounded with a birdie at 11 and another at 18.

Burns could do little wrong on the front nine. He managed a 33 going out after sinking a 10-foot putt on the par-four fifth and a 15-footer on seven. His birdie at the par-five eighth came when he holed out from a sand trap.

On the back nine Burns started slowly. He hooked his drive on 10 into a water hazard but on the next hole he rifled a four-iron three feet from the pin. He knocked in the putt for a birdie-two on the hole. His birdie putt on 18 was another three-footer.

"It's been a long time since I won a tournament," said Burns, who struggled to a 150 total last year after an opening-round 71. "This feels pretty good."

King, who opened the tournament with a 74, fired a 72 Friday to capture first flight honors. He edged Sarasota's Glenn Hadlock by two strokes. Greek captured first place in the second flight while Ron Rizzo of Brooksville grabbed third flight laurels and Bradenton's Chris Knowles was tops in the fourth flight. Knowles ran away with the title when he followed Thursday's 86 with a 76 on Friday for a 162 total.

Chip Johnson of Sarasota and Dave Krak of Palm Beach Gardens tied for first place in the 12-14 age group's first flight with matching 173 totals.
