# Course record spurs Tampa team to FSGA win

NAPLES — Sparked by Bob Cornet's course-record equaling 68, Avila Country Club's No. 1 team came from two shots off the first-day pace and breezed to a 26-stroke triumph in the Florida State Golf Association Club (FSGA) Team Championship Sunday.

The Tampa team posted a brilliant one-under-par score of 287 in the final round at Quail Creek Country Club.

Avila opened with a 301 Saturday and trailed LaGorce Country Club of Miami by two strokes after the first day's play.

Avila No. 1's 588 team total wiped out second-place Ravines near Jacksonville, which posted a 36-hole 614. LaGorce fell to third at 620 and Fiddlesticks vaulted from the eighth spot to fourth with a 622.

Other Southwest Florida finishes were a seventh-place 631 by Quail Creek's No. 1 team; a 669 which resulted in an 11th place finish by The

Forest; a 705 by Bear's Paw which took 15th; and a 713 by Quail Creek No. 2, the 16th-place spot.

Eighteen teams from all over Florida participated in the two-day event.

While Cornet was matching the four-under-par record of 68 from the blue tees, originally set by PGA Tour rookie Curt Byrum, he was receiving bountiful help from his teammates.

Robert Kouwe shot a one-under 71; Kim Schenke contributed a 73 and Rick Brown registered 75. Although teams were made up of six men, only the low four scores each day counted in the scoring.

Cornet, a scratch player and one of the state's better amateurs, put together nines of 33-35 for his 68. He had four birdies and 14 pars Sunday after opening with a 78. "I've won an awful lot of amateur tournaments," he said. "But I haven't been playing all that much lately."

One of the 44-year-old Tampa player's triumphs came in the prestigious Gasparilla Invitational in 1980.

Kouwe, who opened with an 80,

pulled his game back together for his Sunday 71. He is Florida Mid-Amateur Champion.

Schwenke was Avila No. 1's steadiest player and his card of 72-73—145 gave him the individual trophy by a single shot over Cornet. Tom Case Jr. of Fiddlesticks tied for third at 150 after rounds of 77-73.

Mike Yahl of Quail Creek No. 1 also put up a 150 on rounds of 74-76 and in the three-way tie was Dennis Connors of LaGorce who had 73-77.

Case led the Fiddlesticks scoring. Al Johns posted 82-74—156; Jack Stephenson recorded 84-79—159; Bob Hughes had 80-80—160; Rick Nichols registered 81-82—163; and Dr. Stewart Hagen shot 85-82—167.

Howard Palen was low scorer for The Forest contingent and his 85-79—164 won first place in the tournament's Third Flight, made up of amateurs with handicaps between nine and 12.

Most of the field of more than 100 players agreed the course played tough. "The Bermuda rough they had around the greens was what

made it difficult to play," said Kouwe. "Once you got in there, it wasn't easy to get out. But the golf course was in great shape."

Case made the turn Sunday at two-under-par 34 but stumbled with a double-bogey seven on the final hole for his 73. "I missed the green on my third shot," he said. "Then I chipped it and before I knew it, I had a seven."

Johns said the difference between his opening 82 and his last-day 74 came about through an improvement in his swing, brought about by a lesson from his wife.

"Saturday I hit two greens and today I hit 14," he said. "My wife had pointed out that I wasn't triggering my swing before I took the club back. And today, I didn't miss a fairway."

Stephenson said he had problems getting out of the Bermuda rough near the greens the first day.

The FSGA Club Team Championship was the first outside tournament ever conducted at Quail Creek since the 36-hole facility opened in December of 1981.
