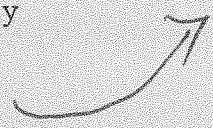

Stackhouse, Whelan take FSGA senior four-ball title

LAKELAND

Dick Stackhouse and Don Whelan combined for a sizzling seven-under-par 65 in Sunday's final round and won the Florida State GA Senior Four-Ball Championship at Lone Palm GC.

Stackhouse, of Boynton Beach, and Whelan, of Deerfield Beach, shot 71 in the opening round and were four shots behind. But their closing 65 gave them a 136 total and a two-shot victory.

"Those guys played just phenomenal to come in with 65," said Cal Korf, executive director of the FSGA. "They were playing in front of the leaders and when they came in it was really a surprise."

Paul Demick of Boynton Beach and Norton Harris of Lake Worth were the first-round leaders at 67. They closed with 71 for 138 and finished second.

Third place went to Key Scales of Weirsdale and Bo Williams of Ocala at 139. They opened with 68 and closed with 71.

Arnold Horleick of Boca Raton and Sam Robinson of Boynton Beach were fourth at 141. They won a tie-breaker over defending champions Holland Aplin of Tampa and Jim Stone of Winter Haven.

In addition to the championship flight there were four additional flights of competition as a field of 100 took part in the annual tournament.
