Patton heads Mid-Amateur

Championship field

Fiddlesticks Country Club's sandy and watery expanses were at their meanest Thursday as the Florida Mid-Amateur Championship made its Southwest Florida debut.

Only Pipp Patton of Temple Terrace was able to break par, Ron Maxon managed to match the Long Mean Course's regulation 72 and a total of 14 contestants were at 75 or better.

Patton fired a brilliant 3-under 69 to take a three-shot lead in the first round of a 36-hole qualifier which finishes today.

Following today's round, the field will be cut to 16 players who move into two days of match play Saturday and Sunday.

Tied for third at 73 were Marlin Detweiler of Orlando, defending champion Bob Kouwe of Tampa and

Veghte slumped to a miserable start with a bogey and double bogey on the first two holes and the Clearwater veteran turned in 4-over 40.

"But I putted real good on the back nine," he said. "I chipped in for one birdie then sank a couple of 15-footers for the other two."

Veghte's 33 on the back nine was the best score registered over Fiddlesticks' Long Mean Course.

Kouwe was playing with a cracked rib but managed to roll in three birdies in his 36-37 round.

"I had to change my swing," he said. "And damned if it didn't work."

Knapp, the No. 1-ranked amateur in the state, was 2-over through the first nine holes but bounced back with birdies at 10 and 11 for an even-par 36.

"I thought the course played extremely easy today," he said. "There was no wind at all but the pin placements were tough."

three-time Florida Amateur titlist Jack Veghte of Clearwater.

Dwaine Roney of Fort Myers was in a pack of four who posted 74s.

Roney's round was highlighted by a hole-in-one at the 189-yard, par-3 eighth.

"I hit a 5-iron and it landed about three feet short of the hole," Roney said. "Then it took one bounce and trickled right into the cup."

In the tie for sixth with Roney were two-time state amateur king Tom Knapp of Tequesta, Louis McHughes of Ocala and Robert Milich of Lighthouse Point.

Tom Case Jr. of Fort Myers was among five players who recorded 75s and Bob Hughes of Cypress Lake shot 76. Jack Stephenson of Fiddles-

Roney was even coming onto the 18th but dumped his second shot in the water and double bogeyed the closing hole. "I putted just horrible," he said.

Case was 4-over after nine but came back with a 1-under 35.

"I just haven't been scoring well lately," the six-time Southwest Florida Amateur champion said.

Stephenson had a fine round going through the first 15 holes.

"I went bogey, bogey, double bogey on the last three holes," he said.

ticks was at 77.

Other area scores were: Mike Womble of Naples and Rich Hartwig of Fort Myers, 78; Ed Ziegler of Fort Myers 79; and Matt Panos of Punta Gorda 82.

Patton jumped off to a sizzling start with birdies at Nos. 2, 5, 7 and 9 to turn at 4-under 32. He bogeyed 10 and 13 — both par-5s — but birdied 18 for a back-nine 37.

The 28-year-old former Miami-Dade North and University of Florida player attributed his fine score to hitting his approaches close.

"I did make one 50-foot putt for birdie at the second hole," he said. "But everything else came from hitting it close a few times."

Moxom, a former mini-tour professional who recently regained his amateur status, had three birdies and three bogeys. He is reigning Sarasota City Amateur champion.

Although the 96 players who started all earned spots in the Mid-Amateur through 18-hole qualifying tests at 10 courses throughout the state, only 38 were able to break 80 at Fiddlesticks.

The competition is restricted to amateurs 25 and over and is not affiliated with the National Mid-Amateur Championship to be contested next month.

Hoping to escape late afternoon rains, the field will go off No. 1 and No. 10, starting at 8 this morning.
