PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. -- Byron and Jeb Whitman, a nephew-uncle team from Juno Beach, won the Florida State Golf Association's State Four-Ball Championship Sunday (Oct. 11), giving Palm Beach County twosomes the title for the third year in a row.

Playing at the JDM Country Club here, the Whitmans had a better-ball score of four under par 68 Saturday to share the first round lead with three other teams. They added a five under par 67 on the East course Sunday for a 135 total, nine under par.

The final round was highlighted by Jeb's eagle-deuce as he holed out a 165-yard 5-iron shot from under the trees at the 365-yard 15th hole for what proved to be the winning margin. Jeb, 41, had one birdie Sunday, two Saturday. Byron, 28, had three birdies each day.

Tied for second, each with 69-67--136, were Richard Ekey, Juno Beach, and Jim Patrone, Boca Raton, with John Harrell and Mike LeFebre, both of West Palm Beach.

The 96-team field was divided three ways: the 50 teams with the lowest combined handicaps played the North course the first round, the East course the second day; the remaining 32 higher rated teams in the regular division, and Mr seniors twosomes, were on the East and North courses, respectively. Then, each flight was split again based on first round scores for the purpose of a wider distribution of prizes. All ties were broken by matching cards.

Last year's winners, John Sanford, West Palm Beach, and Mike Weeks, North Palm Beach, were awarded second in their flight in a match of cards after posting 74-71--145.
