SCAMEHORN COMES BACK TO WIN STATE MID-AMATEUR

Bruce Scamehorn of Winter Haven won the last two holes Sunday afternoon to pull out a 1-up victory over Bill Harvey of West Palm Beach in the final of the Florida State Golf Association conducted State Mid-Amateur Championship at The Loxahatchee Club.

Scamehorn never lead until the championship match was over. He would birdie the 17th hole to draw the match to even for the third time. The 45-year-old won the 18th hole and championship with a par 4.

Play was suspended for nearly an hour due to lightning and rain with the players at the 14th green. When play resumed, Harvey won the hole with a two-putt par to move to 1-up, they havled the next two holes with bogeys, Scamehorn won the next two.

At the 158-yard 17th, Scamehorn hit a 7-iron five feet right of the hole then made his birdie putt. And at the 18th, he hit his 145-yard approach shot to within seven feet and two-putted. Harvey's approach to No. 18 missed the green and he was unable to save par.

It was the second match of the day Scamehorn won at the 18th. In his semifinal match Sunday morning, Scamehorn holed out a 20-foot chip shot to beat Dave Kartner, Palm City, 1-up. In the other semifinal match, Harvey routed Eric Schreiber of West Palm Beach, 6 and 5.

KARTNER ADVANCES TO SEMIFINALS OF STATE MID-AMATEUR

Unheralded Dave Kartner of Palm City won two matches Saturday to advance to the semifinals of the 12th annual State Mid-Amateur Championship at The Loxahatchee Club.

Kartner, who earned the last spot in the 16-player match play draw in a sudden-death playoff Friday afternoon, eliminated two Tampa golfers -- qualifying medalist Jack Callahan 3 and 2 and Wyatt Meyer 2 and 1.

Kartner, 44, meets Bruce Scamehorn of Winter Haven in one semifinal match Sunday morning. The other match pits close friends, Eric Schreiber and Bill Harvey, both members of Bear Lakes Country Club in West Palm Beach.

The semifinal winners will advance to the finals Sunday afternoon.

CALLAHAN CAPTURES MEDALIST HONORS AT STATE MID-AMATEUR

JUPITER, Fla. -- Jack Callahan of Tampa fired a two-under-par 70 to earn medalist honors Friday in qualifying for the 12th annual State Mid-Amateur Championship at The Loxahatchee Club.

Playing in competition for the first time in six months due to torn ligaments in his right thumb, Callahan, 42, posted an even-par 144 total. He made three birdies and a bogey Friday on his way to the low score of the 36 holes of qualifying.

Callahan plays Dave Kartner of Palm City in the opening round of match play Saturday morning. Kartner survived a four-man sudden-death playoff at 154 to grab one of the last three spots in the 16 player field.

The quarterfinals are scheduled for Saturday afternoon, semifinals and finals will be played Sunday.
