LECLAIR WINS STATE MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP

Gentle breezes and mild temperatures continued as Ron LeClair of Fern Park claimed the second annual State Match Play Championship. The Florida State Golf Association event hosted by Wentworth Golf Club in Tarpon Springs hosted 120 of the state's top amateurs.

The former Canadian PGA Tour player, LeClair, continued his brilliant play as he outlasted Jack Zeuthen of Winter Haven, 2 and 1. Although LeClair never trailed, he never lead by more than one until the 17th hole. "I hit the ball well for the first six holes and then just kept it in play," explained the 56 year-old LeClair.

The Fern Park resident, has missed competitive golf for seven of the last 20 years to regain his amateur status on two different occasions. In 1993, LeClair looks to play a full amateur schedule including next week's FSGA State Senior Championship. "I never had the nerves for the game until now. Before I used to be afraid to miss. Now I just get mad."

Tim Iley of Palm Beach Gardens managed to find his old form and capture the first flight with a 3 and 2 victory. Iley admittedly played poorly last summer but, has rededicated himself to his game. Iley's consistent play proved too much for Ron Hyde of Plantation. "Today, I just made no mistakes. This was the best I've played in a long time."

The second flight was won by Mark Pachan of Tampa with a 3 and 2 victory over Jim Beattie of Longboat Key. Local favorite and member of Wentworth Golf Club, Jim Trimble of Palm Harbor defeated Tom Handy of Sarasota after 19 holes in the third flight final.

Next week, May 21-23, the Florida State Golf Association will conduct the State Senior Championship at Grenelefe Resort in Grenelefe. Nearly 200 of the state's top senior amateurs are scheduled to compete in the 54-hole event. FIFTY-SOMETHING VERSUS TWENTY-SOMETHING IN MATCH PLAY FINAL

The 56 year-old, Ron LeClair of Fern Park and 28 year-old, Jack Zeuthen of Winter Haven advanced to tomorrow's final in the Florida State Golf Association event. Both beat pretournament favorites in their morning matches and continued the momentum with afternoon victories.

LeClair had not played competitively in three years in an effort to regain his amateur status. It has not taken long to work out the rustiness, as the former Maine Open champion edged Mike Freeman of Riverview 1-up in their morning match.

The Fern Park resident continued his consistent play in the afternoon as he coasted to a 4 and 3 victory over David Hackstadt of Tampa. "Everyone was playing so bad, I was just playing for pars. 36-holes took a lot out of me," said LeClair. "On this course I am able to hit 3-wood and keep up with the long-hitters' 1-irons. I am surprised to be in the final."

The twenty-something half of the final, Zeuthen, outlasted the 1972 State Match Play runner-up, Gary Stickl of Lakeland, 1-up in their morning match. The match stayed close for 17 holes when Stickl's errant tee shot failed to carry the hazard on 18. Stickl was forced to punch-out of the hazard and settle for a five. Meanwhile, Zeuthen made a difficult up-and-down for par to close out the match.

Zeuthen's next opponent was David Peet of Gainesville. It took a birdie on the par 5 17th to close-out the match 3 and 1. "I was really hitting the ball well today. Putts weren't dropping but, I knew it (his putting) would come around. We had five birdies on the back side between us," explained Zeuthen.

In the first flight of the championship, Ron Hyde of Plantation and Tim Iley of Palm Beach Gardens advanced to Sunday's final. The second flight saw Ronald Beattie, Longboat Key and Mark Pachan, Tampa make the final. Finally, Tom Handy of Sarasota will face Wentworth member, James Trimble of Palm Harbor in the third flight final.

Final matches will begin tomorrow at 8 a.m. The championship match is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. Spectators are welcomed and admission is free.

LACROSSE, FREEMAN, AND STICKL MAKE FINAL EIGHT IN MATCH PLAY

Near perfect conditions continued for the second round of the State Match Play Championship. Sub-par golf in some matches was not enough earn a victory at the Florida State Golf Association event.

Just ask 1992 State Amateur champion, Doug LaCrosse of Orlando who narrowly escaped with a 1-up victory in his morning match with W.K. Himelsbaugh of Clearwater. "He just started throwing-in birdies on the back side. I had to birdie 17 and 18 to win." Quite a task, as the 430 yard par 4 18th happens to be the second most difficult hole on the course according to the scorecard but, number one according to the players. In his afternoon match, LaCrosse had his hands full again with, Robert Floyd of Miami Beach, son of PGA Tour star Raymond Floyd. LaCrosse once again started out strong going 2-up after three holes, but struggled to break away from young Floyd. On 16, Floyd was finally able to pull the match to even with a birdie. LaCrosse countered with a birdie on 17 to move back to 1-up. Having birdied 18 earlier, LaCrosse comfortable hit his approach to the middle of the green, just 10 feet from the hole. Floyd's four was only good for a halve, giving LaCrosse a 1-up victory.

The defending champion, Rick Cloninger of Orlando who was one-under par for 19 holes fell in his morning match to Mike Freeman of Riverview. "Heck, we had 10 birdies between us (Cloninger had 4)," said the gracious defending champion ",it doesn't hurt quite as much, I played really well." The Orlando resident was one up on 18, when his approach shot found the greenside bunker. Freeman made a routine four, as Cloninger failed to get up-and-down to close-out the match. On the 19th hole of the match Freeman drained a 10-foot uphill putt for birdie, which Cloninger could not duplicate.

Freeman's good fortune looked as though it would come to an end in his afternoon match against Brian Houston of Ocala. But the tide would change as Freeman made birdies on 15 and 17 while Houston had back-to-back three-putts on 16 and 17. With the match all square on 18, Houston's bogey on the finishing hole gave Freeman a 1-up victory.

Last year's runner-up in the championship, Gary Stickl of Lakeland, continued his brilliant play as he defeated Bob Pearce of Melbourne 5 and 4. Stickl went 2-up on the sixth hole when an errant second shot by Pearce found the hazard, enabling Stickl's routine par to take the hole. From there on the match belonged to the Lakeland native, as he proceded to take a 5-hole lead to #10. Stickl's length proved to be too much for Pearce.

The matches will begin tomorrow at 8 a.m. Admission is free.
