Defending champ shoots 72, leads junior girls' tourney

The sun baked many golfers at the Florida State Junior Girls Championship at Baytree National on Tuesday, but Miami's Cristie Kerr torched the field.

Kerr, the two-time defending champion, shot 72 for a two-stroke lead in the first flight. RaeAnna Staples shot 74.

Kerr has been busy the last few weeks: She qualified for the U.S. Women's Open and will begin play in two weeks. She's also coming off a victory in the Women's Western Amateur Championship in Elk River, Minn.

She got back to Florida the day before the tournament and only practiced before teeing off.

"I played it pretty steady,"

Kerr said. "I putted well. I was a little conservative and hit only what I could see."

What she saw was a course that recovered well from days of intense rain. The good condition of the course was not enough for others though.

Melbourne's Jennifer Lyons said she didn't quite have the roll of the greens, shooting an 87.

"It was horrible," Lyons said. "I lost focus after the last three holes. I'll have to focus more, I expect to do a lot better."

In the 15-17 age group, Bronwyn Kohn leads the second flight with an 83 and Bryn Welsh was second. Darcey Delaney shot 100 to lead the third flight with Melissa Bush and Bridget Kurczewski of Merritt Island tied for second.

In the 12-14 age group, Sandy Sheperd leads the first flight, shooting 79. Tina Miller and Katie Bucemi tied for second with an 85. Julie Komurke shot 85 to win the second flight. Theresa Bullock and Kristina Prestipino tied for second, shooting 92.

In the 10-11 age group, Kelly Husted took a one-stroke lead in the first flight, edging Elizabeth Staples 44-43. Mallory Code leads the second flight.

The 9-under group was won by Colette Lowe shooting a 48.

Amanda Brooke of Titusville shot 59 in the second flight of the 10-11 age group. Her sister Tracy Brooke shot 103 in the second flight of the 12-14 age group.

The second and final round tees off at 7:30 a.m.

MELBOURNE, Fla. -- Cristie Kerr of Miami has captured the Florida Junior Girls Championship for a record-equaling third year in a row. Kerr shot rounds of 72-70--142 at Baytree National Golf Links to win by six strokes Wednesday (June 28).

Raeanna Staples of North Miami Beach was the runnerup in the 15-17 age group with 148 on a pair of 74s. Staples won the 12-14 age division the previous two years.

The 12-14 champion this year was Jill Crowe of Ormond Beach, who shot 76-75--151.

Other age group winners, playing nine holes each day, were Kelly Husted, Sarasota, 10-11, 43-39--82; and Nicole Hage, Coral Springs, 9-under, 48-41--89.

Michelle McGann of Singer Island is the only other player to win the title three years in a row, 1985-86-87. She has played on the LPGA tour since 1989.

Earlier in the week, Kerr, 17, qualified to play in the U.S. Women's Open, July 13-16 at Broadmoor Golf Club in Colorado Springs, Colo. Already this year Kerr has won the Florida Women's State Amateur Championship, a Futures mini-tour tournament and three national junior titles.

The Florida Junior Girls and Florida Women's State Amateur are conducted by the Florida Women's State Golf Association.
