

CARRON AND RAMSBOTTOM TEAM TO WIN THE FLORIDA STATE NET TWO-MAN TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

TARPON SPRINGS, Fla. — Mark Carron and Craig Ramsbottom, both of Tampa, teamed to win the inaugural Florida State Net Two-Man Team Championship Sunday at The Westin Innisbrook Resort in Tarpon Springs. Rick Long of Auburndale and David Norka of Frostproof finished two strokes back in second place.

The championship started with 18 holes of modified alternate shot net stroke play on Saturday, August 29 on the Eagles' Watch course, Long and Norka jumped out to the early lead with a gross score of 62. Robert Meador (Miami Lakes) and Dave Peterson (Miami), as well as Scott Phillips (Miami) and Phillip Hudson (Miami Beach), fired a 65 for a second-place tie. Carron and Ramsbottom stood in a sixth-place tie with three other teams at 68.

The final round was four-ball net stroke play on the Copperhead course. Carron and Ramsbottom combined for a 61 to vault them into the lead with a 15-under, 129 total. Long and Norka shot a 69 for a 131 total. Meador and Peterson dropped to ninth with a 71, while Phillips and Hudson finished tied for 13th with a final-day 73.
