Bonita junior wins girls title

Catherine Cartwright of Bonita Springs this week shot a 75-76—151 at Broken Sound Club in Boca Raton to win the 12-14 age division of the Florida Women's State Golf Association's Junior Girls Championship.

Cartwright, 13, playing in the annual tournament for the second time, won her division by eight strokes. Her 75-76—151 equalled the score of the tournament's overall winner, 17-year-old Robin Rhein of Fern Park. In last year's FWSGA Junior Girls

Championship, Cartwright finished sixth in the same division.

In addition to statewide recognition as an outstanding amateur — both now and for the years to come — winning her age division earned the Bonita Springs Middle School honor student a bronze trophy as well as a year's custody of a large silver bowl, the base for which is engraved with the names of the tournament's 36 previous winners.

"I've got the silver bowl," said Cartwright, "but not the base. That's being engraved."

She said she won despite tee shots

that weren't up to her usual standard.

"Fortunately my short game was good," she said, "and I putted quite well. I had 28 putts the first day and 27 putts the second day."

Cheryl Parker of Fort Lauderdale, chairman of the event, said this year's Junior Girls Championship attracted the largest field in the tournament's 37-year history.

"The girls come from all over the state," said Parker, "and as players they're getting better and better."

"Certainly Catherine Cartwright is one of the state's rising young stars, and we're very pleased she elected to play in our event."
