## Championship Operations



### Food and Beverages

In addition to the joys received from volunteering at Championships and qualifiers, volunteers are welcome to complementary non-alcoholic beverages and lunches during FSGA conducted events. The Tournament Chairman arranges with the course, volunteers' food and beverages usually charged to the FSGA. Below is guidance on what is appropriate.

#### Morning

Before the tournament round begins, Committee Members are welcome to pick up food and beverages from the clubhouse dining room, snack bar, turn-stand, or the beverage cart as available. It is important to remember that at FJT and Championship events there are coolers of water and snack baskets on each tee box from which you may grab a quick snack for nourishment as needed. The following are items that you are welcome to each morning:

- Snacks
- Coffee
- Water
- Breakfast sandwich



#### Mid-Day

Once play has started, it is important for the Committee Members on the course to use the radio to arrange a time to come in for lunch. Please contact the volunteer head that is on your side of the golf course or the Tournament Chairman to find a good time to venture in to the clubhouse. It is essential for Committee Members to come in for lunch one or two at a time so other members of the Committee can cover their assigned duty out on the course!

Committee Members are welcome to the following options for lunch:

- Menu items
- Buffet (When lunch is included at the Championship for players)
- Beverage cart or turn-stand items



Lunch is the perfect time to cool down and get out of the hot sun for a fair amount of time. However, when ordering food, please take into consideration the amount of prep time needed for the meal to be completed. Also, remember our volunteer shirts are white! Even though an item on the menu may sound great, that doesn't necessarily mean it will look great on your white shirt too.
